



A lawyer, veteran political representative, and long-time advocate of egalitarianism and integrity in Indian public life and society, Shri Ram Nath Kovind was born on October 1, 1945, in Paraunkh, near Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh. His parents were Shri Maiku Lal and Smt Kalawati.

Before assuming charge of the office of the 14th President of India on July 25, 2017, Shri Kovind served as the 36th Governor of the state of Bihar from August 16, 2015 to June 20, 2017.

Educational and Professional Background

Shri Kovind completed his school education in Kanpur and obtained the degrees of B.Com and L.L.B. from Kanpur University. In 1971, he enrolled as an Advocate with the Bar Council of Delhi.

Shri Kovind was Union Government Advocate in the Delhi High Court from 1977 to 1979 and Union Government Standing Counsel in the Supreme Court from 1980 to 1993. He became Advocate-on-Record of the Supreme Court of India in 1978. He practiced at the Delhi High Court and Supreme Court for 16 years till 1993.

Parliamentary and Public Life

Shri Kovind was elected as a member of the Rajya Sabha from Uttar Pradesh in April 1994. He served for two consecutive terms of six years each till March 2006. Shri Kovind served on various Parliamentary Committees like Parliamentary Committee on Welfare of Scheduled Castes/Tribes; Parliamentary Committee on Home Affairs; Parliamentary Committee on Petroleum and Natural Gas; Parliamentary Committee on Social Justice and Empowerment; and Parliamentary Committee on Law and Justice. He was Chairman of the Rajya Sabha House Committee.

Shri Kovind also served as Member of the Board of Management of the Dr. B.R Ambedkar University, Lucknow, and Member of the Board of Governors of the Indian Institute of Management, Kolkata. He was part of the Indian delegation at the United Nations and addressed the United Nations General Assembly in October 2002.

Despite the COVID-19 lockdown, the Placement Cell has successfully aligned activities related to Training & Placement in virtual mode and have engaged leading names in the industry, for exciting and emerging career opportunities for our students. Several eligible faculty members of the University and Colleges have been promoted under CAS and is still in process. Long pending cases of MACPS has been cleared and process of promotion for non teaching employees has been initiated.

The University fully understands its responsibility of capacity building for national development and is making rapid strides to meet the challenges of higher education in modern times. The highest priority has been given to raise the standard of teaching, learning, research and innovation in the University. If the University is to succeed in broadening its horizons of success, it needs the contribution and support of all the stakeholders including the students, the teachers, the staff, the guardians and the people. MILESTONE OF THE UNIVERSITY

The University of Allahabad, established in 1887, is the fourth oldest in India and has to its credit significant academic attainments and contributions towards the promotion of higher education in the country. The University has been a unitary teaching institution (with certain kinds of institutions admitted to its privileges) since 1921, the year it came under Provincial (i. e. State) jurisdiction.

In recognition of its role, endeavours, and contribution in the fields of higher learning, national development, and social engagement, and with a view to help it realize its potential at the national level, the University has been re-incorporated by Parliament, upon the recommendation of the Government of India to that effect, as a Central University by means of the University of Allahabad Act 2005, which received the assent of the President on June 23, 2005, and has commenced on July 14, 2005.

The change in status from State to Central University has been accompanied by significant changes in the functional set-up, inter alia in respect of the constitution of its authorities, the modes and subject matter of internal legislation (the Statutes and the Ordinances), appointment and recruitment procedures, and provisions relating to institutions admitted to the privileges of the University.

The University was assessed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in April 2019, and accredited with a rating of B++.

Presently the University has four faculties; Arts, Commerce, Law, and Science; four university institutes: the Institute of Inter-Disciplinary Studies, the Institute of Professional Studies, Institute of Gandhian Thoughts and Peace Studies, and the National Centre of Experimental Mineralogy and Petrology and five independent university centres: Centre of Behavioural and Cognitive Sciences, Centre for Women's Studies, M.N. Saha Centre of Space Studies, Centre of Vocational Education and Skill Development, National Genomics Core Centre; one constituent institute: Govind Ballabh Pant Social Science Institute and eleven constituent colleges: Ewing Christian College, Chaudhary Mahadev Prasad Degree College, Allahabad Degree College, Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Govt. Degree College, Ishwar Saran Degree College, Sandanlal Savaldas Khanna Degree College, Arya Kanya Girls Degree College, Jagat Taran Girls Degree College, Rajarshi Tandon Girls Degree College, Hamidia Girls' Degree College and K. P. Training College.

Under the stewardship of distinguished Vice-Chancellors (Sir Ganganatha Jha, Pt. Iqbal Narain Gurtu, Prof. Amaranatha Jha and Prof. Tara Chand) and the academic leadership of illustrious faculty, the University took determined steps to enlarge its intellectual and educational ambit and gave a lead in national emancipation. In view of its achievements, as well as its position among the universities of Uttar Pradesh, the state government accorded it formal recognition in July 1992 as a 'Premier Institution' (Vishesh Agrani Sanstha), and at one point in time; it was called the "Oxford of the East". Several teachers and students played a prominent role in the national struggle, particularly from 1930, and the University solemnly recalls with pride the martyrdom of its student Lal Padmadhar Singh during the Quit India Movement.

The University has had on its rolls a host of politicians and statesmen including one president and two vice-presidents of India, two former prime ministers, several union and state ministers, at least four chief justices of the Supreme Court, besides a large number of senior bureaucrats and has contributed immensely to the Defence Sector of the Country.

The scholars who gave an idiosyncratic aroma to the academic vibes of the University, from its first venture into teaching in 1905, are too numerous to be named individually, and included such legendary figures as Amaranatha Jha, Raghupati Sahai "Firaq", S. C. Deb and P. E. Dastoor (English), H. N. Randle, R. D. Ranade, and A. C. Mukerji (Philosophy), L. F. Rushbrook Williams, Sir Shafaat Ahmad Khan, R. P. Tripathi, G. R. Sharma, D. C. Panday (History), Syed Muhammad Ali Nami and M. G. Zubaid Ahmad (Arabic and Persian), Udai Narayan Tiwari (Linguistics), P. K. Acharya, Babu Ram Saxena and Kshetresh Chandra Chattopadhyaya (Sanskrit), Dharendra Verma, Devi Prasad Shukla and Ram Kumar Verma (Hindi), Syed M. Zamin Ali and Muhammad Hafiz Syed (Urdu), Beni Prasad, Tara Chand, Ishwari Prasad (all three being historians of repute) and A. B. Lal (Political Science), R. N. Dubey (Geography), P. S. Naidu, S.B. Adawal (Education), Meghnad Saha, K. S. Krishnan, D. S. Kothari, Salig Ram Bhargava, R. N. Ghosh G. B. Deodhar and K. Banerjee, Prof. Rajendra Prasad Singh nickname Rju Bhैया (Physics), N. R. Dhar, Satyeshwar Ghosh and N.R. Dhar, Satya Prakash (Chemistry), A. C. Banerji, Gorakh Prasad, P. L. Srivastava and B. N. Prasad (Mathematics), J. H. Mitter, Shri Ranjan, R. K. Saxena and R. N. Tandon (Botany), D. R. Bhattacharya and H. R. Mehra (Zoology), H. Stanley Jevons, S. K. Rudra, C. D. Thompson, B. P. Adarka and J. K. Mehta (Economics), M. K. Ghosh and R. C. Choudhury (Commerce) and J. C. Weir, M. U. S. Jung, K. K. Bhattacharya, K. R. R. Sastry and T. N. Sapru (Law).

The University is now exploring the new magnitude of the institutional achievement, by renovating its academic system, reinforcing and augmenting its teaching, research and residential facilities and pursuing social purposes in a coordinated manner, to keep pace with international standards in these areas and endow human resource with the capabilities to serve the nation in the special context of the challenges and imperatives of globalization.

HIGHLIGHTS OF UNIVERSITY INITIATIVES

ACADEMICS

- The world faced an unprecedented situation due to the pandemic COVID-19. The entire regular activity was disrupted, and the country went in the lockdown mode on March 24, 2020. To ensure least disturbance in academic calendar, the University of Allahabad had initiated online teaching. The faculty members accepted the challenge and the University went through the transition quickly and efficiently towards remote teaching as well as being connected with the students by conducting online classes to complete the syllabi.
- To supplement ONLINE teaching in a better way and organised manner, the University has established its own video studio, which became functional by the end of July 2020. The University faculty is utilizing the facility for recording good quality lectures not only to be uploaded on the University portal but on the public learning portals as well.
- Major funding under DST-PURSE, DST-HFIBF, and DST-fMRI and National Genomic Core Project were provided to the University.
- The extra-mural funding has increased as new departments were granted DST-FIST support.
- To make University web-enabled, the best utilization of ICT tools in administration and teaching is being done.
- The University successfully completed admission process despite the Covid 19 pandemic conditions by conducting an online and offline Entrance Test for UG, PG, Professional, and Ph.D. courses for admission to various courses of study for the academic session 2020-21. This helped the University to attract talented and potentially bright students from all over the country.
- The University, due to Covid 19 situation, concluded the end semester examinations including professional courses in online mode
- An innovative centre of Vocational Education & Skill Development has been created and made functional in the University to deliver trained and skilled human resource to the country so that the country may become self-reliant. In the first phase, it will provide manpower in the area of Software application packages development, designing and providing a networked environment and maintenance of computing peripherals, storage, etc.
- Due to the pandemic, it was not possible for the departments to organize conferences, seminars, or workshops in the normal mode. So the departments had to switch over to the virtual mode. Different departments of the University and its constituent Colleges organized webinars to mentally engage the faculty members and the student community during the lockdown period.
- National and International Webinars were organized throughout the year in nearly all the academic units from April 2020 to March 2021.
- The Placement Cell has successfully aligned the activities related to Training & Placement in virtual mode despite the pandemic and have engaged leading names in the industry, for exciting and emerging career opportunities for our students.
- Online/virtual placement of the students was conducted through nine organizations viz. Extramarks Education Pvt. Ltd., Wipro Limited, Piramal Foundation's SDDNN Campaign, TCS, HCL Technologies, Kaivalya Education Foundation, Prism Johnson Ltd. and Axis Institute, where 1744 students participated.
- Over 1500 students are at various stages of online selection process in organizations including Azim Premji Foundation, Piramal Foundation, TCS, Wipro, HCL, Axis Institute, Prism Cement and Genpact.
- To enhance the quality and frequency of placement activities, collaborative efforts have been initiated for Employability Training, Skill Development and Internship Programs of students with organizations like Piramal Foundation, Tata Consultancy Services, CSRBOX for IBM SkillsBuild, CSRBOX for Career Orientation Sessions by BOSCH INDIA and Internshala.
- Over 1000 students from general streams were provided an opportunity to enhance their skills and improve on their employability through virtual internships, training programs and live sessions from industry experts.

- The procurement of new types of equipment in various departments was done through equipment grants by the Government e-Market.
- Timely and continuous monitoring of the progress of the research students has drastically improved the research standards and quality of Ph.D. Program of the University.
- The Library subscribed to 176 journals, approx. 18648+ e-journals and 12 e-databases. The access of these resources was provided through UGC-INFLIBNET Consortium, i.e., e-Shodhsindhu, and subscription by the University.
- Many of the faculty members and students of the University bagged prestigious fellowships and awards of national and international importance.
- Due to Covid 19 pandemic, the Convocation of the University could not be held in year 2020, however the University is in the progress of organizing the Convocation in September 2021.

ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCE

- Recruitment rules of non teaching were finalized and preparation of roster is under process.
- Long pending issue of Date of Eligibility is resolved and several eligible faculty members of the University and Colleges have been promoted under CAS and is still in process.
- Long pending cases of MACPS have been cleared and process of promotion for non teaching employees has been initiated.
- The recruitment of Teaching and Non Teaching positions is under process and will be done shortly.
- The General Financial Rules (GFR)-2017 and its subsequent amendments are being strictly followed.
- E-procurement (e-tendering and e-publishing) system and GeM are fully functional in the University for procurement of goods and services as well as for works (manpower) allotment.
- The VISAKA (Vittiya Saksharta Abhiyan) guidelines have been implemented in the University.
- Financial accounting is being done so that maximum transparency may be ensured to have a proper system in place.
- The financial transactions of the University have become cashless. The digital initiatives of the MHRD have been fully implemented in the University.
- The University actively participated in all the national schemes proposed by MHRD and UGC.
- The CCASH is functional to provide prompt relief to the complainants as per its guidelines.
- The University actively participated in all the Govt. of India initiatives such as Yoga Day, National Science Day, Guru Purnima, Environment Day, etc.

EFFECTIVE USE OF THE ICT FOR TEACHING, ADMISSIONS, AND E- GOVERNANCE

- University of Allahabad recognized the importance of providing the students with the type of networked computing environment they can expect to work. A programme of continual improvement ensures that both hardware and software are the latest.
- University of Allahabad has launched its new website in month of March, 2021 that provides secure access, both on and off-campus, to coursework, electronic teaching and learning materials, exam results, and a variety of other information and services, much of which is personalized.
- Wireless network of University of Allahabad is available throughout the campus enabling mobile access to resources from a wide range of personal devices.
- University is continually working and developing innovative ways of using technology to support teaching and learning through virtual learning environment.
- University is planning to enhance its ICT facilities, in coming years by Incorporation of e-Office and Business Analytics system in University and increasing the bandwidth of the campus-wide LAN (including the hostels) and the Wi-Fi facility from 1 Gbps to 10 Gbps through NKN.

- New lecture hall complex, with large lecture theaters, with ICT enabled infrastructure is coming up to be shared by various departments to address effective teaching.
- The campus-wide CCTV surveillance system, having pan, tilt, and zoom cameras, with the centralized control room, is being effectively used to cut down the security expenditure on the campus.
- The University is fully utilizing the digital initiative of MHRD, namely the MOOCs platforms like Swayam, NPTEL, ePG Pathshala, Swayamprabha, etc, as well as GIAN scheme to ensure that best and updated lectures are available to the student community.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND STUDENT AMENITIES

- Hon'ble Governor, Uttar Pradesh Smt. Anandiben Patel inaugurated recently conserved Vijayanagram Hall, the heritage of the University and surrounding area on 5th March, 2021.
- Tilak Bhawan is fully refurbished and inaugurated by the Vice-Chancellor on occasion of Women's day.
- Construction of Students' Activity Centre has been completed within the stipulated time. The building will provide facilities for the extracurricular activities of the students.
- Construction of Sophisticated Advance Instrumentation Centre and M.N Shaha Centre is in advance stage of completion. It will provide much needed facilities for the research work.
- Construction of Girls Hostel is in advance stage of completion. In first phase it will provide accommodation for 124 girl students. There is future scope for further vertical expansion in the proposed hostel.
- Construction of New Boys Hostel is at the verge of completion. It will provide accommodation for 218 Boys students. It also has provision for future vertical expansion.
- Construction of International Hostel for the International Students as an annexe of the present International Hostel and will provide accommodation for 34 students.
- Prof. Ishwar Topa Academic Complex building is being constructed from the donation provided by an alumnus of the university Prof. Ishwar Topa. The building has provisions of Large Lecture Theatres and Halls for Academic purposes. The building is in final stage of completion.
- Efforts are on to repair the famous and classic clock tower of the University, housed in its main senate-house campus
- Efforts are on to hoist a high mast national flag in the senate-house campus of the University.
- Efforts are being made to increase the out-reach activities for better linkages with society.
- University has installed solar panels of the capacity of 1.434 MW. During the period April 2020 to March 2021 the university generated 15,39,859 (Fifteen Lacs Thirty-nine Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty-nine) units of Solar Power.
- Plantation of trees is carried out at regular intervals to keep the campus as green as possible.
- Anti-ragging cell, as per UGC guidelines, is fully functional.
- NCC and NSS organized several activities throughout the year.
- Recreation and sports facilities have been upgraded in the campus.
- Efforts are on to upgrade the Health Centre of the University.
- Freeships, Scholarships, Poor Boys Fund, Merit-cum-means scholarships were distributed to economically weaker students.
- Jawahar Lal Nehru Centre for differently-abled students of the University has been further equipped with state of-the-art facilities.








Total no. of students (Category wise) 2020-21

DEPARTMENT OF ANCIENT HISTORY, CULTURE & ARCHAEOLOGY

Introduction:

The department was founded in 1955 with the objective of promoting research and teaching in Ancient History (including pre-history and proto-history) and Ancient World Civilizations. The department excavated the world famous archaeological site of Kaushambi from 1948 to 1964 with outstanding results. The department was chosen for Special Assistance Programme (SAP) by the UGC for three consecutive phases from 1981 to 1995. It was also granted the status of Centre of Advance Study (CAS) from 2001 to 2006. The department carried out International Collaborations with a) University of California, Berkeley (1980-82), b) Soviet Union on the Project, “Comparative Archaeology and Ethno-Linguistic Studies” (beginning in 1980), and 3) Australian Research Council (2005-2008). The Department is Internationally recognized for its studies in Socio-Economic Puranic studies and Art. This department gets the credit of starting Archaeology in Northern India.

Department has following facilities:

- **G.R. Sharma Memorial Museum** developed out of cultural material recovered mainly through excavations and explorations in the Northern Vindhya and the Middle Ganga Plains by the archaeologist of the Department.
- **Experimental Archaeology Lab:** Since its inception, January 2010, the lab has been engaged in understanding **Cognitive Ecosystem of archaeological landscape** combining the results of the various scientific experimental techniques.
- **Archaeo-Zoological Lab:** for Archaeozoological Researches.
- Departmental Research and PG Library.
- Lab of Archaeological Chemistry.
- Photographic Lab.
- Surveying Drawing Lab
- Computer Reprographic Lab.

From time to time, learned professors across the world visited and interacted with faculty members, research scholars and students of the departments. The latest visitors include a team of scholars from Delhi and Boston, USA. Our departmental museum (Prof G.R. Sharma Memorial Museum) houses a unique collection of antiquities spanning from Prehistory to early historical period. Research/scientific analysis is being carried out on different antiquities and artifacts. The department has archaeological research laboratories, a Photography Unit, a Drawing Section, Libraries (PG, as well as, Research) and a Publication Unit.







The Department of Anthropology was established in the year 1985 and was headed by the eminent anthropologist late Prof. A.R.N Srivastava. The department was earlier seated in the Senate House Building of the University. In the year 2003, it was shifted to the Banda Guest House building of the University and subsequently since 2016 the department is located in the newly constructed New Academic Complex of the University.

Since its inception the Department of Anthropology has contributed immensely to the academic delivery of the University. The department provides education at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels.

The department caters to both biological and social branches of the discipline and has well-equipped laboratories for Osteology, Osteometry, Prehistoric Archaeology, and an Anthropology Museum displaying human evolution through casts of human ancestors and various cultural objects of present-day tribes of India. 















DEPARTMENT OF MEDIEVAL AND MODERN HISTORY

Introduction:

The Chair of Professor in Department of History was created in 1912-13. Academic lectures and teaching commenced in December 1916. Gradually eminent historians joined the department on the invitation and appointment made by the first HOD, Prof. L. F. Rushbrook Williams. Those joining in 1917-1919 period include Ishwari Prasad, R. P. Tripathi, Beni Prasad, Sir Shahafat Ahmad Khan and Dr. Tara Chand. Two of the above earned the D.Litt. degree of the London University by working under the legendary Haraold Laski – Beni Prasad and R. P. Tripathi. By 1935, when the first session of the Indian History Congress was held at Pune – it was deemed necessary to unanimously elect Prof Shahafat Ahmad Khan, the then HOD of our Department as its first president because of the immense contributions made by the historians working under his stewardship. Their contributions gave rise to what emerged later as the “Allahabad School of History”.





DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC AND PERFORMING ARTS

Introduction:

Established in 1926, the Department of Music and Performing Arts has a long and illustrious history, when the well-known music lover and the renowned academician Dr. D.R. Bhattacharya started a Music Association in 1926 and the first music conference was organized under the auspices of this Association and Dr. D.R. Bhattacharya, the Vice-President. Two years Junior Diploma in vocal and instrumental music was started in 1935 and diploma in painting in 1937 started in Women's College campus. In 1942 Senior Diploma in Vocal and Instrumental Music was introduced and in 1945 the music vocal, instrumental and painting became a formal academic subject at undergraduate level and the regular teachers were appointed. It was only in 1947 that Dr. Amarnath Jha, Vice-Chancellor of Allahabad University laid down the foundation of the building of Music department and in 1950 a small building was constructed for the music department and inaugurated by the then Hon'ble Governor Sri. H.P. Modi. But again this building was handed over to Urdu Department in 1968 and the Music classes were again shifted to Women's College campus. Only in 1970 by the courtesy of Prof. A.B. Lal, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor, building of the music department was constructed and inaugurated on the auspicious occasion of Basant Panchami in 1971 and since then the department has flourished on every front from 1973 onwards. P.G. classes were started and research work also began as a follow up. Many students of the department emerged as national level artists as well as they occupied important position in academics or other important work places. The department till now offered teaching for B.A., M.A. and Diploma courses and conducted research, but from July 2003, the department of music has introduced Bachelor of Music (B. Mus.) three years Degree course in Vocal / Sitar / Tabla and M.Mus. from 2006-07 for enriching the quality of teaching music and to advance specialized training to the students. From 2005, the department included male candidates in B. Mus programme as a follow-up in M.Mus also. In B.A. this provision was since 2001. The department also introduced practical screening test for P.G. entrants in Music from July 2003 and included Rabindra Sangeet in B.Mus degree programme. The department also started 2 years diploma course in Indian Classical Kathak dance from session 2006-07. Started new course in P.G. MPA in Vocal, Sitar and Tabla from 2016-17. B. Mus 3 years UG course changed in 4 year BPA programme from session 2016-17.

Thrust Areas:

- Traditional teaching under Guru Shishya Parampara is imparted to the students to enable them for Performing Arts in their respective field.
- To provide teaching in Musicology aspect of Music.
- To provide teaching in Dhrupad/ Dhamar, Tappa, Thumri in vocal Music, Swar Vadya Pakhawaj with Tabla.
- To provide Music Teaching job oriented viz Music critic, Music recording, Music Director, Music arranging.
- To develop Audio-Visual recording (Digital) .









DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

Introduction:

The Department of Psychology at Allahabad University was established in 1961 with Prof. Durganand Sinha as the first chairperson and two other faculty members. In 1977, the UGC approved it as a Department of Special Assistance (DSA) and the faculty strength was increased to 20. In recognition of its outstanding contribution to the field of Psychology in India, the Department was upgraded as the centre for Advanced Studies (CAS) in 1984 by the UGC. The Department was evaluated by the UGC and second, third and fourth terms of CAS were sanctioned between the period 1989 to 2008.

In 1989, the Department started an international journal 'Psychology and Developing Societies' in collaboration with the Sage publications which is now in its 32nd year. The Department was the first in the University to start D. Phil. with course work as early as in 1979. Semester system in P.G. Programme was started in the Department in 1989 and later on, in 2001, the Department adopted 'Choice Based Credit System' in P.G. Programme. The Department has Departmental Library which is recognized as regional resource center.







DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

Introduction:

The Department of Economics became a truly full-fledged department in 1914, with the appointment of Herbert Stanley Jevons (son of the marginalist, W.S. Jevons) as the first Professor of Economics and Head. A post-graduate course was also introduced the same year, so that the full fledgling department offered both, under-graduate and post-graduate courses. Origins are like riddles which may never be completely solved, and the Department of Economics is no exception. However, some sources also point to the year 1908, when the teaching of Economics as a subject commenced at the under-graduate level, though it remained under the Head of the then History Department. In view of the above, 2014 is taken to be its Centenary Year of the Department. Prof. Jevons also founded the Indian Journal of Economics, in the year 1916, the first economics journal ever to be published in India. This is the oldest existing journal of Economics and is regularly published, even today. In an article, published in its first volume in 1916 and available even today in the Department, Prof. Jevons wrote that his academic purpose was “*teaching to think and to do, rather than of teaching only to know*”.

This legacy of his was faithfully adhered to by stalwarts like Professors C.D. Thompson, A.R. Burnett-Hurst and S.K. Rudra, Mr. B.P. Adarkar, and later by Professors J.K. Mehta, P.C. Jain, S.L. Parmar, Mahesh Chand and many others. Faculty members such as Prof. H.S. Jevons, Prof. C.D. Thompson, Prof. S.K. Rudra and Prof. J.K. Mehta became Presidents of the Indian Economic Association Conferences of 1922, 1934, 1946, and 1968 respectively. Former faculty of the Department who became Presidents were Dr. M.V. Mathur (1967), Prof. Gautam Mathur (1978) and Prof. P.D. Hajela (1980). Allahabad had the proud privilege of hosting I.E.A. conferences in the years 1920, 1929 and 1940.

It also has a Planning and Development Unit, created through an endowment by the Planning Commission, Government of India, with the renowned development economist, Jean Dreze was Associated with it as the Honorary Chair Professor. The UGC also selected the Department under Special Assistance Programme (SAP) in 2004-05, DRS-I level. The Departmental library has more than fifteen thousand books and it subscribes 35 national and international journals.

The Department recently formed an Alumni Association and the first Alumni meet was organized on Feb.14, 2014, the meet was a grand success and it was attended by more than two hundred alumni. The Department is holding meetings of the Association every year since then. The Department has celebrated its Centenary Year in 2014.





Introduction

Law as a subject was introduced in the year 1872 in affiliation with the Calcutta University. In 1887 the Department of Law was established and in the year 1890, the Department became a separate single Department /Faculty of the University along with the Faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce. Hon'ble Justice D. Straight was appointed as the first president of the Department. The Law Department functioned in Muir College from 1872 onwards till the new building was constructed for the Law Faculty around 1910, adjacent to Senate House. By an Act of the United Province of British India. Prof. Weir, a distinguished jurist became the first Head of the Law Department. The Department was shifted to the new building which was constructed by UGC grant in the Chatham Lines Campus of which Hon'ble Mr. A.K. Sen the then Law Minister of India, had laid the foundation stone in 1965





Introduction:

The Department of Biochemistry was established in 1968 by the legendary Professor Dr. Radha Pant. At that time University of Allahabad was one of the few Universities in the country to start a Master's course in Biochemistry. In view of the growing importance of Biochemistry, both as a basic science as well as a broad based discipline, the Department also introduced Biochemistry at the undergraduate level in the year 2000. The Department presently offers a 3-year undergraduate program (B.Sc.) with Biochemistry as one subject, a 2-year Master's program (M.Sc. Biochemistry) and a Doctoral program (Ph.D. Biochemistry). Department organizes weekly students' seminars and frequent invited lectures by leading scientists from across the world with a view to develop quality personnel in the field of Biochemistry. 



DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

Introduction:

Department of Botany is a well-known department of University of Allahabad. The Department which was earlier a part of Biology Department of Muir Central College started as a separate entity in the year 1923, with Dr. J.H Mitter as the founder Head of the Department. Now, the department has completed 97 years of its glorious existences under the stewardship of eminent botanists like Prof. S Ranjan, FNI, Prof. R.K. Saxena, FNI, Prof. R.N. Tandon, FNA, Dr. A.K. Mitra and Prof. D.D. Pant, FNA and others who have adorned the professorial chair of the department. In recognition of its academic excellence, the department of botany was awarded two prestigious programs by the UGC 1- The special assistance program (1976) 2- The COSIST support program (1990).

- **Roxburgh botanical garden and Experimental farm-** The department is maintaining perhaps the best botanical garden in the country which is famous for the rich collection of rare Pteridophytes, Gymnosperms and Angiosperms. It is maintaining the best collection of rare Cycads and Conifers.
- **Agharkar Museum-** The department has a Botanical Museum which is located on the first floor of east wing of the botany department. The museum is well known for its rare collection of living and fossil plant belonging to different plant groups from Algae to Angiosperm.
- **Duthie Herbarium-** The department is maintaining the best collection of herbarium plants of various groups like Bryophytes, Pteridophytes, Gymnosperms and Angiosperms. It includes the rare prized collection of Duthie, King, Kustler, Dudgeon, Cave, Wallich and Gamble. There are nearly 25000 specimens.
- **Central Instrumentation laboratory-** Department has central instrument facility (CIL) equipped with AAS, UV-Vis spectrophotometer, HPLC, High Speed Refrigerated Centrifuge and MilliQ water purification system.
- **Departmental Library-** The Departmental Library contains about 13,000 books on Botany and 250 books on Environmental Science.

Thrust Areas:

The department offers teaching in two main courses at the post-graduate level: 1. Botany, and 2. Agricultural Botany. The post-graduate courses are having semester system. The under-graduate program is integrated with B.Sc. curriculum of the Faculty of Science. The curricula are continuously updated. The ongoing research program emphasizes diverse areas of functional, structural, applied and evolutionary botany. The main emphasis is given on the following areas which are identified by UGC as areas of excellence:

- 1- Palaeobotany, Morphology and Anatomy
- 2- Plant Pathology including Microbiology
- 3- Plant Physiology

There are other areas of interest like Taxonomy, Bio-diversity, Palynology, Ecology, Cytogenetics and molecular Biology which are also attaining excellence.





Introduction:

The Department of Earth and Planetary Sciences (DEEPS), University of Allahabad was established in the year 1985 as a post-graduate teaching department employing Semester System and to carry out research in the frontier areas of planetary geosciences, especially Experimental Mineralogy and Petrology at variable temperatures and pressures. 



DEPARTMENT OF ELECTRONICS AND COMMUNICATION
J.K. INSTITUTE OF APPLIED PHYSICS & TECHNOLOGY, UNIVERSITY OF ALLAHABAD

Introduction:

Soon after independence, the first Prime Minister of India, Pt. JawaharLal Nehru realized the need of a pioneer institute in the fields of Applied Physics, Microwave electronics and Upper Atmospheric physics and other applied physical sciences. On his initiative, an agreement was signed between University of Allahabad and J.K. Trust, Kanpur on November 22, 1947 to establish Department of Applied Physics and Technology in the premises of Muir College Campus, Faculty of Science, University of Allahabad. J. K. Charitable Trust contributed for the construction of the complete building of the institute and hence it was named as J. K. Institute of Applied Physics and Technology. In the year 1976 it was renamed as the Department of Electronics and Communication of University of Allahabad.

The foundation stone of the Institute was laid by the first Prime Minister of India Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru on April 14, 1949. Pt. Nehru also inaugurated the first academic session of the institute on April 4, 1956. Initially a three year M.Sc. (Technology) post-graduate degree course was started in the department. Later in 1967, on the advice of AICTE and UGC, the course was bifurcated into a three year Bachelor of Technology (B.Tech) degree course in Electronics and Telecommunication (after B.Sc.) and to a three semester post graduate degree course i.e. M.Tech. in Electronics Engineering. Further, in the year 1982 a new course/subject in Computer Science (as one of the subjects in B.Sc.) leading to a Bachelor's degree in Science was introduced. Subsequent to the introduction of new subject in Computer Science at undergraduate level, it was desirable to have a full-fledged Post Graduate course in Computer Science.

The Department was sanctioned a prestigious DRDO Project (the only centre in North India) by the name "Manpower Development in the area of Computer Science" in the year 1986. Under this project, a Post-graduate course in Computer Science named as M.Sc. Computer Science (Software) was introduced. In the year 2008, three-year B.Tech. (Electronics and Communication Engineering) course was replaced by 4-year B.Tech. (Electronics and Communication Engineering) degree course after 10+2. A new branch of Engineering in Computer Science leading to Bachelor's Degree in Technology i.e. B. Tech. (Computer Science and Engineering) was also introduced in the year 2008. The Department started a new three-year Post Graduate degree course named as Master of Computer Applications (MCA) from the academic session 2018-19.

Thrust Areas:

Broadly department has two thrust areas

- **Electronics and Communication Engineering:** Microwave Engineering, Microstrip Antenna, Embedded Systems, Optical Fiber Communication, VLSI Technology, Microwave and Antenna, Milli-meter Waves, Fiber Optic Communication, High Performance Computing, Soft Materials and Condensed Matter Physics etc.
- **Computer Science and Engineering:** Image Processing and Computer Vision, Natural Language Processing and Sentiment Analysis, Parallel and Distributed Computing and Cloud Computing, Cyber Security and Internet of Things, Optimization and Multimedia, Cryptography and Big Data Mining, Real-Time System design, Computer Networks WSN, MANET, Machine Learning, Data Science, Deep Learning etc.





DEPARTMENT OF HOME SCIENCE

Introduction:

The department of Home Science was established in 1945, in pre independent India, with a two year undergraduate course with the objective to educate women. The name of the department has been changed in the year 2021 to the Department of Family and Community Sciences. The department currently has 4 academic programmes - 1 Undergraduate course - B.Sc. 















High Fluence Ion Beam Facility

Introduction:

The high fluence ion beam facility at University of Allahabad is fully functional and user experiments as well as in-house experiments by PhD students can be proposed and performed. Department of Science and Technology, New Delhi has sanctioned a project titled “Utilization of HIGH FLUENCE ION BEAM FACILITY (UHFIBF) vide letter no. SR/MF/PS-04/2017/G” worth a fund of INR ~4 Crore to run the facility.

Thrust Areas:

- The objective is to run the accelerator based research facility in Allahabad University using ECR ion source to create an environment for pursuing experimental work in interdisciplinary areas.
- Accelerator based laboratory will provide best possible environment for training human resource as it encompasses latest technologies such as data analysis, computer control, analog and digital instrumentation, Ultra high vacuum, etc.
- It will be gradually developed for providing opportunity to younger generation to get involved in projects involving state of the art technologies.
- An in-house facility of this type in the university will most certainly help in attracting students towards experimental sciences.

Main features

a) ECR source (Supernanogan)

1. Large area scanning: The beam can be raster scan for the large target area of 30 mmx 30 mm (± 15 mm x ± 15 mm)
2. High flux and high current: Because of high current from the ion source high flux of ions can be implanted in very short time period.
3. Switchability: The switching time between metal ions and gaseous ions is ~2-3 hours.

4. Range of ions: We can produce the metal ions by heating and sputtering techniques depending on element's melting point. Elements with higher melting points can be produced by using sputtering methods.



CENTRE OF SCIENCE AND SOCIETY

Introduction

With the approval of Academic Council vide *Resolution No. 43/22 dt.19.5.2015* and *Executive Council Resolution No. 03/32 dt.2.6.15* and subsequent office Memorandum No. *Comm. Sec./5243/2015 dt. 22.08.2015*, the green signal was provided to start the M.Sc. four-semester CBCS based course in Rural Technology and Development under the Institute of Inter-Disciplinary Studies (IIDS) by the University of Allahabad with the intake of 15 seats. The course was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Justice M. C. Tripathi of Allahabad High Court in 2015-16 and the first batch has come out very successfully in 2017. Seats have been increased as per the reservation laid down by UGC i.e from 15 to 19 seats of M.Sc. in current session. Centre has a profound record of research also. Seats in research are decided as availability and norms of UGC and University of Allahabad. The University took lead to translate the PURA (Providing Urban Amenities in Rural Area) of Dr. A.P.J. Kalam and its execution by PM Modi's Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojana by adopting Ramapur Village of Bahadurpur block in Phulpur Tehsil of Allahabad District. In the 1st phase chakzhaura Moja purely SC populated with a high percentage of Females has been selected by the University for their Upliftment. Centre has again adopted five (05) Villages of Koraon Block, Prayagraj as an initiative of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and MHRD, New Delhi. Moreover, the Centre has got the responsibility of the Post-project evaluation study of Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojna of 104 villages of Uttar Pradesh.

It is also worth mentioning that the University of Allahabad has been identified as a spoke partner of the Design and Innovation Centre of IIT-BHU, getting funds from MHRD. Further, the university approved the change of nomenclature from M.Sc. Rural Technology and Development to M.Sc. Design and Innovation in Rural Technology in 2017.



MISSION OF THE CENTRE

The Centre aims to achieve excellence in education and research meeting new developments and challenges. The Centre endeavours for advancement of scientific knowledge through basic and applied research and conducts outreach programmes for larger human welfare.

While it began in the mid-1950s, "Cognitive Science" has established itself as a truly interdisciplinary subject, having roots in psychology and interfaces with philosophy, computer science, mathematics, linguistics and neurosciences in the last three decades. The discipline of Cognitive Science is an intellectual enterprise that studies computational and neural mechanisms underlying mental processes by drawing on resources from a number of disciplines. The academic programs of the Centre include Doctoral and Master programs in Cognitive Science.

The goal of the teaching programme is to enrich students with knowledge of mental structures and processes, physical and chemical laws that govern the activities of brain, and computational models of cognitive processes. There is lot of emphasis on Master's thesis projects where in the students get trained in the state of the art experimental designs and analysis also resulting in presentations in major conferences as well as publications. 


Outreach activities







Centre of Food Technology was established as one of the centre of Institute of Professional studies under Statute 30(I) (ii) read with section 3(Y) & section 27(L) of the University of Allahabad Act 2005. Centre of Food Technology initiated M.Sc Nutritional Sciences programme in September 2000 and M.Sc. Food Technology programme in July 2002 with the support of the Ministry of Food Processing and Industries (MoFPI) under its “Manpower Development programme “. The Ph.D. programme at centre was started in year 2009. In 2015, UGC has also approved and sanctioned grant for offering B.Voc. Food Processing and Technology programme in linkage with Sector Skill Council of India.

The Centre has been sanctioned MoFPI grant from time to time for setting up and upgrading commercial food quality control laboratory to serve the industry in surrounding areas by providing testing services for quality assurance and food safety. 



NATIONAL CENTRE OF EXPERIMENTAL MINERALOGY AND PETROLOGY

Introduction:

The National Centre of Experimental Mineralogy and Petrology (NCEMP) is a research institute of the University of Allahabad. The main aim of the NCEMP, UoA is to conduct high pressure-temperature experimental studies pertaining to the Earth, its interior and planetary materials. Various experiments for the synthesis of glasses, minerals, rocks and super hard materials, measurement of conductivity and seismic velocity in rocks, phase transformations in minerals, and rate of ascent of magma, etc. are routinely conducted using sophisticated high P-T facilities.

There are different types of High P-T equipments available, such as Walker-type Multi-Anvil High Pressure-Temperature (2.5 to 25 GPa; up to 2000°C) apparatus, Piston-Cylinder (1-4 GPa and up to 1500°C; Boyd and England type) equipment and externally heated Tuttle-type hydrothermal apparatus (up to 4 kb and 1000°C). High temperature (Super Kanthal 33) can attain up to 1700°C for short duration experiments and can continuously work at 1600°C for longer duration under atmospheric pressure. The NCEMP has sophisticated analytical equipments such as Electron Probe Micro Analyzer (Jeol JXA 8100 Superprobe), Phillips Pananalytical X'Pert High Score Powder XRD equipment, a Bruker Alpha (Germany) infrared spectroscopy instrument with ATR spectrophotometer (4000–500 cm⁻¹ under ~ 24 °C and 1 atmospheric pressure) for material characterization and a thermal conductivity measurement instrument. It also has a well-equipped workshop and other sample processing facilities. The Centre has facilities for the study of gemstones and synthesis of advanced novel materials such as sol-gel synthesis, melt quenching, hot press and ball milling techniques etc.





STUDENTS' WELFARE ACTIVITIES

MAJOR ACTIVITIES

The year 2020-2021 marked with the DSW set up making tangible gains by way of consolidation and giving thrust to its major initiatives. Better amenities, larger financial allocation in assistance to students, better healthcare, hygiene, sporting activities and, the last but not least, the hard fought and won peace and tranquility in hostels and the campus have been the cornerstone of the multifaceted activities of the preceding year. Progress and development have been at the core of DSW and his team endeavors. Here are some of the modest successes achieved through sustained team spirit and camaraderie to which the DSW Board with Asstt. DSWs, faculties, officers, staff, and students have contributed immensely.

Scholarship and financial assistance to the students by the DSW office

- Disbursal of Rs. 20,000,00/- as scholarship to poor though meritorious students under the Govt. of India sponsored 'Merit-cum-Means' based Scheme. The scholarship awarded to 323 students of UG/PG/IPS/Professional courses @ Rs. 5000/- per student for a session. For the session 2020-21, 323 eligible students were awarded McM scholarship.
- Financial assistant for the purchase of books to the poor students out of **Poor Boys Funds** account. For the session 2020-21, 410 eligible students were awarded for financial assistance. Financial assistance was also given to students of different units of the University for organizing their annual functions.

Welfare Measures (General)

Health Facilities of Students:

- University Health Centre is running for the medical welfare of students and employees of the University under the supervision of Senior Medical Officer. Homoeopathy doctor, lady doctor, para-medical staff and two ambulance facilities are also available for students welfare. This facility is available on 24x7 hrs.
- **Travel Concession**-Travel assistance is provided to the students in different modes by Indian Railway for participation in Inter University sports tournaments, Departmental educational tours, Concession for home town travel and monthly seasonal ticket etc.

Welfare of Physically challenged students.

- Differently-abled persons require special aids and appliances for their daily functioning. Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Differently abled Students established in 2009 is the nodal Centre for facilitating and supporting academic and digital inclusion for the differently abled students of the University. In the session 2020-2021, it continued to provide the necessary academic resources for the students. The Centre is equipped with computers, scanners, several screen reading software's (specially meant for visually challenged) etc. The centre is actively involved in facilitating the admission of students in the hostels for the visually-challenged students run by the State Government. The differently abled students are given priority in admission in University hostels and are also accommodated in State Government hostel through the efforts of the centre.
- **Admission of physically challenged students**- DSW office is continuously working with the Director, Admissions to facilitate physically challenged candidates to get admission in different courses of the University (UG+PG+Law+Professional courses) by organizing medical boards for examining disability of the candidates seeking admission under physically challenged category, and recommend genuine candidates for admission

Mental Health Board (MHB) - MHB is a group of faculty members under the chairmanship of Prof. K.P. Singh, DSW and Senior Medical Officer and Head, Department of Psychology, UoA provide advice and solutions to mental health issues, wellness program and counseling of students. The MHB also works to fight stigma around mental health and educate students about mental health and wellness considering the Covid-19 protocol.

Students Activity Centre (SAC)—Student Activity Centre (SAC) of the university will create opportunities to more readily connect students with their peers, mentors and support systems, so our entire community can come together to nurture the hearts, minds and wellness of the hands we're putting our future into. Our young generation will network with their future employees, deepen their relationships with faculty and staff and form some of the best memories of their campus life. The basic idea of SAC is to build a place, within the heart of campus, where young people feel safe, included and inspired to share and shape ideas that may become the solutions for our world needs. The centre is equipped with state-of-art facilities like library, reading room, indoor sports facility, meeting cum mini conference hall, cafeteria and open Gym.

NSG Policy for students –There has been several cases of students’ exigencies in terms of general and life threatening diseases etc. At times the financial assistance is not sufficient and some of the students belonging to weak economic background are unable to meet the cost of the exigency. The university was also unable to access the large sums sometimes required for this purpose therefore the students are provided insurance cover under **Nagrik Suraksha Group Policy** from Oriental Insurance Company Ltd. initiated and executed by DSW office. This policy will cover an accidental claim up to **05 lacs** on death and up to 04 lacs on hospitalization for 24 hrs with due information to DSW office and company.

International Yoga Day- On 21st June, 2020. International Yoga day was organized in which Hon’ble Vice Chancellor, University officers, teachers, employees and students participated through online mode from their home. Only limited number of faculty and staff performed in the campus maintaining social distancing and proper masking as preventive measures.

Pink Toilet with Common Hall – Pink toilets are more than just about the shade of the paint on these toilets. Meant for only women, these toilets do more than provide privacy to women in the campus. The student welfare initiative made by DSW office to provide a pink hall and a pink toilet to facilitate female students of Allahabad University (AU) in the session 2020-2021 became operational. Three pink toilets have been constructed with a big hall attached to it accommodating more than 100 students at a time. The hall is built over an area of 1,200 sq feet, adjacent to the music and performing arts department in faculty of arts. It is a central facility available for all female students of the University of Allahabad. The hall has proper seating facility along with Hindi and English newspapers, mobile charging hub and RO-fitted water cooler. Furthermore, two more pink Toilets-cum-common hall facility for girl students in faculty of science and Arts will become operational soon.

CAB Compliance - Hand sanitization and thermal screening have been made mandatory at all key points, including at hostels, special centres, and in administration building. All the students have been appraised about the proactive efforts of the DSW office in undertaking the efforts to promote and comply with Covid Appropriate Behavior (CAB).

Massive Sanitization Drive – DSW office made its initiative to provide masks, sanitizer, face shields, gloves. to the staff and faculty members with the help of university administration. All hostels are sanitized regularly to face the menace of the Covid pandemic. All University hostels have developed their own facility for regular sanitization.

Corona Virus Test Camp – DSW office of the University had organised a Covid testing camp on its campus with the help of the district administration for all faculty members, staff and students of the university on 18 September 2020.

- One **new girls Hostel** of 124 seats capacity in under construction is in advance stage of completion.
- One **new Boys Hostel** of 224 seats capacity in under construction is in advance stage of completion..

JAWAHARLAL NEHRU CENTRE FOR DIFFERENTLY ABLED STUDENTS

Jawaharlal Nehru Center for Differently -Abled Students (JNC DAS) was established in 2009 during the Eleventh Plan. Only a few Universities/colleges in India have such a facility for the differently-abled students. It is an enabling unit for the differently-abled/ *divyang* students. Significantly, the Coordinator of JNC DAS was also made the Chairman of Equal Opportunity Cell in 2016 and this gave an even greater help to the Center in mainstreaming the issues of the differently abled students of the University.

In 2020-21 25 students were enrolled with it. The Center has a computer lab with e-books as well as screen reading software like NVDA for the visually challenged persons. Several e-books were added to the center's existing learning resources which consist of more than 400 e- books in 12 different subjects.

Like last year more than 30 students got accommodation in State Government Hostel (Rashtriya Uchha Siksha Adhyanrat Dhristibadhit Chatravas) especially designed for the *divyang* students. Grievances were promptly redressed. There was an ongoing process to distribute mobility and assistive devices to students.

During 2020-21 the facilities of the Computer lab continued to be provided. Several students associated with the Center got success in acquiring JRF, National Fellowship for the Physically Challenged, NHFDC and other prestigious fellowships and scholarships. The University has initiated the procedure for carrying out the Access Audit of its buildings that will also comprise the estimated cost required to make changes (if any) for making the campuses barrier free. According to the ICT cell of the University the new website of the University is mostly in compliance with the prescribed guidelines as far as access to the differently abled to it is concerned. A few remaining accessibility gaps are also being sorted out.

An important development on 2020-21 was that the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor constituted an internal committee comprising of the teachers, staff, student and parents to look after needs of differently abled persons of University of Allahabad. In particular the committee was entrusted to take care of day-to-day needs of differently-abled persons as well as of the implementation of schemes. Thrust Areas

National Integration Camp: National Integration Camp (NIC) is organized every year and the duration of each camp is seven days with day and night boarding and lodging.

Adventure Programs: These programs are organized every year in which about 1500 National Service Scheme volunteers participate, out of which at least 50% volunteers are girls. These camps are organized in the North East region, Arunachal Pradesh and Himalayan region.

Republic Day Parade Camp : This camp is held every year from 01 to 31 January in Delhi. This NSS team also participates in the Republic Day parade at Rajpath in New Delhi.

National Youth Festival: National Youth Festival is organized every year from 12 to 16 January by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India in collaboration with the State Governments in different parts of the country.

With a view to assist international students, University has established an International Students Office in the University campus. The University of Allahabad model for Internationalization of Higher Education has these unique features:

- With the approval of UGC and the Central Government, the International Student Advisors Office of the University proposes to have a number of MOUs signed with leading Universities whereby sharing of the facilities in the university and exchange of Faculty and students can be made possible.
- Besides looking after admissions and eligibility, the Office of the International Student Advisor coordinates with ICCR, Ministry of External Affairs, different embassies and consulates for various purposes including grant/award of Scholarships.

Hostel Accommodation Facility:

The University maintains a separate boys' hostel for International Students and female students are accommodated in 18 separate girls hostel. Very soon, the University of Allahabad with the support of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD), Government of India will construct a new hostel for accommodating 158 students with separate state of the art self sustained apartments adjacent to the present International House.

Sponsored Student Programs

The Sponsored Student Program is a part of International Student Advising and Services (ISAS) at the University of Allahabad with the specific goal of assisting sponsors and sponsored students by:

- Supporting the academic goals of sponsored students and their sponsors.
- Providing records of student's academic standing when requested.
- Facilitating communication between students and sponsors to help with financial and administrative questions.
- Working with the Sponsoring Agencies as well as the Foreign Registration Office to answer sponsored students' questions and to help students in maintaining and understanding their immigration status.

Services for Sponsored Students

- A special orientation session for sponsored students.
- Help with providing medical facilities when required. Facilitation is given to Sponsored Students to avail medical insurance, if the student desires.
- Help sponsored students communicate with Academic Departments, and Sponsoring Agencies.
- Reminders for students with expiring financial guarantee/support letters.

Services for the Sponsor:

- Student transcripts to show academic standing upon request.
- Special campus meetings for sponsors to meet with their students.
- Manage Financial Guarantee for Sponsorship

Activities of the International Student Office

The University of Allahabad attracts a large number of foreign students in comparison to other Indian Universities. Apart from offering a multi-cultural and inter-disciplinary learning environment, one of the main reasons for studying in Allahabad is the manageable cost of wing and a favorable environment for education, currently, we have around 100 students from over 15 countries studying at the University and its affiliated colleges.

The International Students Office of the University of Allahabad assists the International Students Community, in acquiring information about the various courses, collages tuition fee structure, eligibility, accommodation, health insurance and the accommodation offered by the University. The International Student Office administers the special over and, above quota of International Students, created jointly by the Ministry of External Affairs and Ministry of Human Resources and Development (MEA & MHRD) Government of India. The International Student Office acts as the nodal agency that coordinates all the activities related to the admission of International Students, provides facilities through a unique single-window system. Apart from handling the admissions and eligibility procedures, the International Student Office coordinates with the Indian Council for Cultural Research (ICCR), Ministry of External Affairs and Ministry of Human Resources and Development (MEA & MHRD) and with different Embassies and Consulates for various purposes including getting scholarships as well as in administering MoU's with International Partners of higher education. The International Student Office acts as a liaison between the students, the various Departmental Heads, and the Heads of Colleges and Institutions affiliated under the University of Allahabad as well as the Heads of Chancery, Embassies, Consulates, their educational counselors and their educational wings, throughout the world or with any other agencies of the Government of India or the Government of other countries.

PROCTOR OFFICE

1. To maintain the dignity, discipline, peace and order in the university campus and the surrounding area, 24x7 focused security cell was formed by the Proctor, under which every effort has been made that the students can live in a friendly environment.
2. After the admission work, about 22500 (two thousand five hundred) regular and ex-students of all classes were issued new identity cards.
3. In the last session, about 1200 students were given character certificates.
4. The entrance examinations and admission work conducted by the university in undergraduate/postgraduate and all other courses were completed peacefully with the wide cooperation of the proctorial board.
5. The Proctorial Board members thoroughly checked the students at the examination centres during the annual and all the main examinations conducted by the University. The remaining exams were postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
6. Totally curbed ragging as directed by the Supreme Court:
 - (a) Anti-ragging committees were formed in each faculty and hostels.
 - (b) The names and mobile numbers of the members of the Anti-Ragging Prevention Committee were displayed through posters in all the departments and hostels of the University.
7. A special women's cell has been constituted by the Registrar's office, especially to listen to the problems of the girl students and to solve them, in which the women members of the proctorial board are active, who fulfill their responsibilities from time to time.
8. About 25 show cause notices, 08 suspensions and 13 FIRs were lodged at Colonelganj police station by the Registrar's office to put a complete check on the chaos taking place in the university campus.
9. Keeping in view the COVID-19 pandemic, in collaboration with the University Administration/District Administration/Police Administration, the students residing in all the hostels were made aware about the safety concerns, so that the students can make their own decision to return to their home districts.
10. According to the decision/order of the university administration, the vehicles of the students are kept free of cost. For the safety of vehicles, token slips are provided free of cost at cycle stands, for which no fee is collected from the students.

CENTRAL LIBRARY

Introduction:

The Central Library has started its journey on the path of improvement. It was established to cater the needs of the students, research scholars, and teachers of the University. It not only helps in supporting the class room instructional programmes of the University, but also unfolds the horizon of knowledge with regard to the different research programmes carried out by the University.

The Central Library developed out of the library of the Muir Central College, Allahabad (established in 1872, and affiliated with the university from 1872 to 1922, when it was subsumed in the university upon beginning its career as a teaching University). Foundation stone of the University library building was laid by Sir John Hewett on 17th Jan.1910. The University Library was started in 1916. In 1946-47, Dr. S. R. Ranganathan, Father of Library Science in India, was invited to suggest ways and means of improving the library. He submitted the development plan in March 1947, which was published by the university in the same year. Its contents covered wide range of areas: such as new library building, manpower, finance and other relevant items. The present library building was constructed in 1973. The present library building is more spacious and has potential for further expansion. The old library building is now occupied by the office of the Registrar, as well as Accounts and General section of the University.

Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme (DDC) and Anglo American Cataloguing Rules-2nd edition (AACR-2) are followed for the purpose of classifying and cataloguing the documents. LIBSYS-4, Library Management Software is being used for creation of database.

Working Hours: Library is kept open from 8:00AM to 9:00 PM from Monday to Saturday and from 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM on Sundays and holidays except on Republic Day, Holi, Eid-ul-Fitr, Independence Day, Mahatma Gandhi's Birthday, Vijaya Dashami, Diwali and Christmas.

Membership: Library membership is open to the members of the University community (i.e. teachers, officers, research scholars, students and other employees of the University). Consultation facility is also provided to the teachers and research scholars of other universities and colleges, on production of proper identity /recommendations from concerned authority.

Subscription of print Journals: The Library subscribed to 176 print journals on behalf of various departments.



University of Allahabad recognises the importance of providing the students with the type of networked computing environment they can expect to work. A programme of continual improvement ensures that both hardware and software are the latest.



UGC HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

Introduction:

For improving the quality of higher education, different Commissions including Radhakrishnan Commission (1948) and Kothari Commission (1966) on higher education had recommended a sustained and purposeful development of academic staff. The National Policy on Education 1986 (NPE) has, inter alia, suggested that the present educational system does not provide opportunities to the teachers for professional and career development, initiative for innovative and creative work, and internalizing the techniques and value system to fulfill their roles and responsibilities. Programme of action of NPE 1986 categorically mentioned a comprehensive programme of professional development through ASCs. Consequently, in 1987 the UGC sanctioned the setting up of 48 ASCs. The ASCs started functioning with the premise that the objective of Academic Staff Development Scheme is to enable academic staff to become effective facilitators of student learning through becoming effective managers of the conditions that affect learning.

The main aim of the Human Resource Development Centre (HRDC) has been to facilitate quality education by upgrading the knowledge and performance of teachers serving in Universities and their affiliated Colleges. By organizing the abovementioned programmes, the Staff College has given the teachers, the opportunity to come to a platform where interactions with eminent resource persons and with other teacher participants were possible. The programmes covering a wide spectrum of subjects have provided the crucial link between motivation of teachers for creative and innovative teaching and research, commitment towards their profession, academic leadership and quality education.

Thrust Areas:

- Invocation of basic thoughts on being a good teacher - Values, Character, Commitment, Team Building, Work Culture, Human Resource Development and Academic Leadership qualities required in teachers for Societal Transformation,
- Creating Computer Awareness and in this way developing IT trained human Capital for quality education of the future generation, Power point Presentation, LCD and OHP usage
- Revitalizing inputs for Higher education through Teacher empowerment, Inter-disciplinary dialogues, open and flexible Trans-disciplinary subjects, Innovative teaching Methodologies, Collaboration with Academic, Research and Specialized Institutes
- Creating awareness about the higher education System, Rules ,Regulations, Statutes and Policies, Motivation for Research, Project Writing, Funding Agencies and Avenues
- Weaving Gender Justice and Gender Equality in the system through lectures/ workshops/seminars on Capacity Building, Gender Sensitization and Gender awareness
- Stressing the importance of mental and physical health by lectures and demonstrations by Yoga Experts and practice sessions by the teacher participants. This has become an integral part of all Orientation Programmes
- Organizing programmes and activities related to Social and Communal Harmony, Secularism and National Integrity such as lectures and Literary programmes, Essay Writing Competitions, Cultural Evenings, Group Discussions and Seminars
- Inviting eminent Resource Persons and Subject Experts for both OPs and RCs and giving teachers the opportunity to interact with them.

In session 2020-2021, the UGC-HRDC has successfully completed most of the programmes allocated by the UGC for the session in the online mode. It has organized 4 out of 4 **GURU DAKSHTA: FACULTY INDUCTION PROGRAMME** with 133 participants and 09 out of 09 **Refresher Courses** (Including Winter School and Teacher Educators programme) with 313 participants. Besides the subject Refresher Courses conducted by the concerned department, 5 Interdisciplinary Refresher Courses were organized successfully by the HRDC. This included 1 ID in Human Rights, 1 ID in Media Studies and Governance, 1 Information and Communication Technology, 1 in Teachers Education and 1 Special Winter School Programme. HRDC has been ranked amongst the first ten HRDCs of the country based on the OPs and the RCs conducted by the HRDCs.

The HRDC has also organized 7 out of 9 Short Term Programme (Including workshop and Webinar) with 314 participations.





HAMIDIA GIRLS' DEGREE COLLEGE

Introduction :

Hamidia Girls' Degree College was established in 1975, the International Year of Women and functions under the aegis of **The Association for the Education of Muslim Women at Allahabad**. It caters to the needs of higher education of girls and women and has maintained its accessibility to all sections of the society, especially Muslims girls. The College is a unique center of quality modern higher education and vocational skills. Presently approximately 1300 girl students are enrolled in three faculties in UG & PG Courses at the College.

Highlights:

- The College was given affiliation by the University of Allahabad in 1975. It started with six subjects in Bachelor of Arts. Then it added eight subjects. Presently there are fourteen subjects – twelve Conventional & two vocational in the Faculty of Arts at UG level. Post Graduate classes are functional in 5 subjects – English, Urdu, Sociology, Medieval History & Education as granted by the University of Allahabad in 2016. In 2017 M.A. in Arabic is also sanctioned yet to be started. Now Research Degree Programme (Ph.D.) in Urdu sanctioned by University of Allahabad shall start from the next session.
- Taking forward the vision of the Association and to fulfill the mission more faculties have been added – since 2001 with the approval of the University of Allahabad Faculty of Commerce where Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com) is functional and Faculty of Vocations where Bachelor of Vocations (B.Voc) in three trades - Journalism & Mass Communication, Fashion Design and Software Technology are running successfully. In the session 2019-20 M.Voc. in Fashion Design and Embroidery started it was sanctioned by UGC and has been approved by the University of Allahabad. In this session 2020-21 three more vocational courses were sanctioned by the UGC and approved by the University of Allahabad – B.Voc. in two trades – Office Administration & Secretarial Practices and Social Media & Digital Marketing. One Certificate Course – Advance Pattern Making in Fashion Design.
- Centre for Women's Studies sanctioned in XI Five Year Plan of UGC running by the College since 2009.

Introduction:

Founders of the College Late Mr. S. N. Kakkar, Prof. D.D. Khanna and Mr. Ashok Mohiley were committed to girls' education. They founded the S.S. Khanna Girls' Degree College to impart quality education to girls' from economically and socially backward sections of society. The college starting with humble beginning in 1975 and today is a premier constituent college of the University of Allahabad. The college has five faculties: Arts, Science, Commerce, B.Ed and Legal Studies.

In 2016 during the XIIth Plan period, the University Grants Commission conferred the college status of "College with Potential for Excellence (CPE-Phase II)". At present the college runs professional courses in Office Management and Secretarial Practices, Computer 'O' Level and One Year Diploma course in Biotechnology. Looking into the interest and skill development of girl students, the college has also started Diploma in Fashion Designing (UGC Approved) in 2020.

इलाहाबाद नगर उत्तरी क्षेत्र की जन आवश्यकताओं की पूर्ति हेतु, यह महाविद्यालय उत्तर प्रदेश शासन के आदेश दिनांक: 25 सितम्बर, 1997 द्वारा इसी तिथि को सृजित हुआ एवं इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा प्रदत्त सम्बद्धता के उपरान्त इस विश्वविद्यालय के एक सहयुक्त महाविद्यालय के रूप में अस्तित्व में आया। 14 जुलाई 2005 को इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय को केन्द्रीय विश्वविद्यालय का दर्जा प्राप्त होने के उपरान्त 24 नवम्बर, 2006 को यह महाविद्यालय, इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय का संघटक महाविद्यालय बना। इस महाविद्यालय में स्नातक स्तर पर तीन संकाय यथा: कला, विज्ञान एवं वाणिज्य संकाय के 16 विषयों में स्नातक स्तर की शिक्षा तथा स्ववित्तपोषी पाठ्यक्रम के अन्तर्गत स्नातकोत्तर स्तर पर प्राचीन इतिहास, हिन्दी, राजनीति विज्ञान, भूगोल, रसायन विज्ञान, जन्तु विज्ञान, रक्षा अध्ययन एवं वाणिज्य विषय में शिक्षा प्रदान की जाती है। महाविद्यालय को वर्ष 2001 में 07 नये विषयों यथा: समाजशास्त्र, मनोविज्ञान, गृहविज्ञान, संगीत, शिक्षाशास्त्र, मानवशास्त्र एवं अर्थशास्त्र की सम्बद्धता इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा प्रदान की गयी थी जिनमें पद सृजन प्रक्रिया कार्य परिषद् के स्तर पर लम्बित है तथा यू.जी.सी. की स्वीकृति के उपरान्त इस 7 नये विषयों में शिक्षण आरम्भ हो सकेगा। इसके अतिरिक्त महाविद्यालय में स्नातक स्तर पर समाजशास्त्र एवं शिक्षाशास्त्र में स्ववित्तपोषित पाठ्यक्रम में कक्षाएँ संचालित हैं। महाविद्यालय की सर्वाधिक महत्वपूर्ण अकादमिक उपलब्धि में वर्तमान शिक्षण सत्र में राजनीतिविज्ञान, वाणिज्य एवं रक्षा एवं स्नातकोत्तर अध्ययन विषय में इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा शोध कार्य की अनुमति प्रदान की गयी। विभिन्न विषयों में 15 शोध छात्रों का नामांकन हुआ है। फाफामऊ में स्थित यह महाविद्यालय ग्रामीणांचल का एकमात्र महाविद्यालय है, जो इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय केन्द्रीय विश्वविद्यालय का सहभुता महाविद्यालय है। सीमित संसाधनों और सुविधाओं के साथ यह महाविद्यालय शिक्षकों, कर्मचारियों और मेहनती छात्रों के संयुक्त प्रयासों से शिक्षा के एक उत्कृष्ट केन्द्र के रूप में विकसित हो रहा है।

इस महाविद्यालय में वर्तमान सत्र 2020-2021 में स्नातक स्तर पर कुल 1980 विद्यार्थी पंजीकृत हैं तथा स्नातकोत्तर स्तर पर 310 विद्यार्थी पंजीकृत हैं। ग्रीष्मावकाश के बाद वर्तमान सत्र का प्रारम्भ कोविड-19 के कारण दिनांक: 17 अगस्त, 2020 से हुआ। इलाहाबाद विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा सम्पन्न करायी गयी स्नातक प्रवेश परीक्षा के परीक्षा परिणाम के आधार पर इस महाविद्यालय में स्नातक एवं स्नातकोत्तर प्रथम वर्ष में मेरिट के आधार पर छात्र-छात्राओं को दिनांक: 04 अक्टूबर, 2020 से प्रारम्भ कर दिनांक 30 नवम्बर, 2020 तक प्रवेश दिया गया। विश्वविद्यालय के निर्देशानुसार कोविड-19 के सापेक्ष शिक्षण कार्य आरंभ हुआ। स्नातक द्वितीय, तृतीय एवं स्नातकोत्तर तृतीय सेमेस्टर की कक्षाएँ दिनांक 17 अगस्त, 2020 से प्रारम्भ हुई। वर्षपर्यन्त, विषय मर्मज्ञ एवं अनुभवी प्राध्यापकों एवं विजिटिंग प्राध्यापकों द्वारा नियमित पठन-पाठन और सह शैक्षणिक एवं प्रसार गतिविधियाँ संचालित की जा रही हैं। इस महाविद्यालय में सिप्सा छद्म के तहत विभिन्न कार्यक्रमों का आयोजन किया जा रहा है।

इस महाविद्यालय में दूरस्थ शिक्षा प्रदान करने वाले विश्वविद्यालय, उ.प्र. राजर्षि टण्डन मुक्त विश्वविद्यालय का अध्ययन केन्द्र हैं। जिसमें 20 से अधिक विषयों में दूरस्थ शिक्षा प्रदान की जाती है। महाविद्यालय में सत्र 2020-21 में कोविड-19 के कारण ऑफ लाइन क्रिया-कलाप संचालित करना संभव नहीं है। ऑनलाइन एकेडमिक प्रोग्राम में शिक्षक अपनी सहभागिता कर रहे हैं।

सत्र 2020-2021 के क्रिया-कलाप:

- सत्र 2021 में निर्मित नयी बिल्डिंग को टेक ओवर किया गया।
- श्यामा प्रसाद मुखर्जी के व्यक्तित्व एवं कृति-वेबिनार, राजनीति विज्ञान विभाग।
- वर्तमान चुनौतियों के सन्दर्भ में समाज की संवेदना और साहित्य -अन्तर्राष्ट्रीय वेबिनार (हिन्दी विभाग)
- बदलते परिवेश में गाँधीवादी मूल्यों की भूमिका विषय पर 6 दिवसीय कार्यशाला-दर्शनशास्त्र विभाग
- पुस्तकालय का नवीनीकरण।
- शिक्षण कक्षों के फर्शों का निर्माण।
- रसायन विज्ञान विभाग प्रयोगशाला का अधूरा कार्य पूर्ण
- महाविद्यालय कैम्पस पूर्णतः वाई-फाई सुविधा से लैश किया गया।

महाविद्यालय के पास अपने सीमित संसाधन हैं किन्तु गुणात्मक शिक्षण, अवस्थापन विकास, परिसर अनुशासन या परीक्षा की शुचिता, इस संस्था को विश्वविद्यालय की एक उत्कृष्ट संस्था बनाती है। छात्र एवं छात्राओं को स्वच्छ शौचालय एवं शुद्ध पेयजल उपलब्ध कराने तथा शिक्षण/परीक्षा कक्षों में प्रकाश की समुचित व्यवस्था हेतु महाविद्यालय प्रयासरत है। यू.जी.सी. से याचित अनुदान की प्राप्ति के उपरान्त अतिरिक्त शिक्षण कक्ष एवं प्रयोगशालाओं की वर्तमान क्षमता में अभिवृद्धि का कार्य आरंभ किया जायेगा। छात्र हित हमारी प्रतिबद्धता का केन्द्र बिन्दु है तथा महाविद्यालय के सभी प्राध्यापक एवं कर्मचारी छात्र-छात्राओं के सर्वांगीण विकास हेतु कटिबद्ध हैं।
